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## Letter from the President

Dear Friends

Thank you for your ongoing interest and support for our work in Sri Lanka. I am pleased to report that we have had another busy year, and our program continues to expand.

During the past year we have added a third University to our online teacher training partnership. Along with the University of Jaffna and South Eastern University of Sri Lanka, the highest ranked University in Sri Lanka – the University of Colombo – has joined the partnership. Then In July 2026, the University of Vavuniya came on board also.

Our advocacy work continues both through the media, seminars, and our work with the Universities.

As I write this preamble in August 2026, having been in Colombo for a range of meetings in July, we are drafting an updated strategy which will see us expand our advocacy, training and AI-powered app solutions to encompass secondary grade English language literacy development and post-school language development both for post-secondary study and professional usage.

Our Striving Reader initiative which we undertook in 2025-2026 on a pilot basis has proven difficult to implement in a school environment. So, we are turning our focus to tuition centres where the tutor has completed our training. We will be launching this program, again on a pilot basis, this year.

I would like to thank all our members, volunteers, and other supporters for your continued support to PIMD.

# PIMD Overview

- Purpose
  - Partners In Micro-Development Inc. is formed for the purpose of undertaking development projects in Australia and overseas at a grass-roots community level focusing on education for children and adults, small business capacity building, and community level ICT services.
- Objectives
  - The objectives of the association are to build sustainable communities at the grass-roots level by enabling them to access development resources more readily than is possible through macro-level aid and development programs; and to accelerate development at area and country levels by linking these communities together to share resources.
- Activities
  - The main activities of the organisation include but are not limited to :
    - (a) Build partnerships with other capable organisations to carry our projects.
    - (b) Develop tools (e.g. teaching resources) for use by projects and elsewhere.
    - (c) Raise funds for projects through :
      - (i) donations and sponsorship including member fees/subscriptions;
      - (ii) multi-lateral and bi-lateral aid agency funding programs; and
      - (iii) provision of consulting and other fee-based services.
- Values
  - Partners in Micro-Development (PIMD) is dedicated to improving access to education in developing countries and communities. In doing so, we value:
    - 1. Building partnerships
      - with those in the developing communities so that the real needs of the local people can be discerned, and so that they participate in determining their development priorities.
      - in our own community in order to foster increased understanding of our mutual development needs in both developed and developing countries.
      - amongst global organisations involved in development initiatives.
    - 2. Eradicating poverty through targeted education programs – so that through increased levels of basic language and ICT literacy, grass-roots communities are empowered to take effective hold of their destiny.
    - 3. Respecting and promoting the dignity of each human being – through enhancing and developing the knowledge and skills required to create a sustainable community environment.

  - Monica Vaughan, Treasurer has a Bachelor of Arts, Diploma in Education, a Masters in Theology and over twenty-five years experience in teaching, and ten years experience in business management. Monica also holds a Bachelor of Theology, Masters in Theology, and Post Graduate Diploma in Accounting; she is actively involved in community development within her own locality.
  - Judy Hawkes, Secretary has a Bachelor of Arts (Mathematics and Sociology) and over twenty years experience in ICT management and consulting both in the USA and Australia.
  - Emma Boundy, Literacy specialist, holds a Bachelor of Education, teaches Primary School in Sydney. Emma co-authored the Grade 3-5 literacy based syllabus for the Lotus Program. Emma has also designed and conducted teacher training in Sri Lanka and continues to work as part of the team implementing the program and training teachers remotely.
  - Helen Farrell, EAL Consultant, has a Teaching Certificate, Bachelor of Arts in Literature and a Master of Arts in Linguistics. She has over 30 years' experience teaching in High Schools and in the Higher Education sector. Currently she is involved in mentoring teachers in Sri Lanka as well as participating in local community activities.
  - Rihana Nowfar, Bachelor of Education, in progress Masters in Linguistics is a dedicated primary English teacher and co-author of the Lotus ABOE Phonological Awareness Guide, Rihana also contributes her talents as a documentary scriptwriter and translator in Tamil and English.



# Financial Report – Management Committee Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2026

- PIMD is incorporated as an association under the NSW Associations Incorporation Act 1984 . The date of incorporation is 16 June 2003, Incorporation No. INC9879930.
- PIMD is a registered charity with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission.
- PIMD is governed by a Management Committee. The Management Committee for PIMD present their report together with the full financial report of PIMD for the year ended 30 June 2026.
- The principal activities for the period under review were continuation of the University short-course teacher training program at the University of Jaffna and South Eastern University of Sri Lanka, and further development of AI-powered apps to support teachers.
- All activities of PIMD in this period were funded mainly from donations through Rotary Australia World Community Services, member donations, the Kandaiya Foundation, and contributions in kind from members (time and expertise).
- Funding requirements for the 2026-2027 financial year will continue to be met from the same sources including funding from the Kandaiya Foundation which was established as a private charitable trust with funds bequested by the late Mahesan Kandaiya.
- As a registered charity under the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission, PIMD fully complies with all reporting requirements and best practice governance.
- PIMD is registered with the national NGO Secretariat in Sri Lanka and reports on an annual basis to the Secretariat.

- (d) Other Project costs have included the annual Kotobee licence for our online resource library, illustrations for decodable readers for elibrary, monthly zoom costs for delivery of online courses, small resources for schools, Vimeo subscription for hosting webinar recordings for teacher –training purposes.
